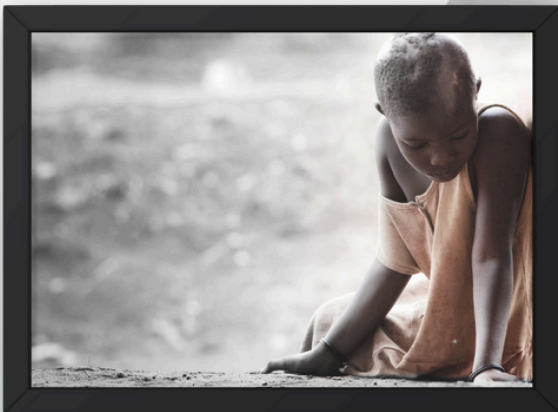

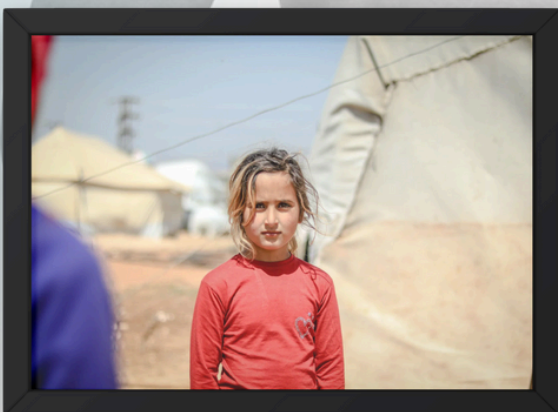

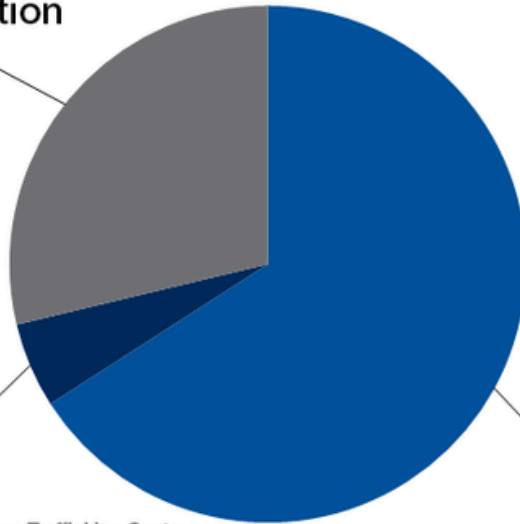

\$8 billion | 5.3%



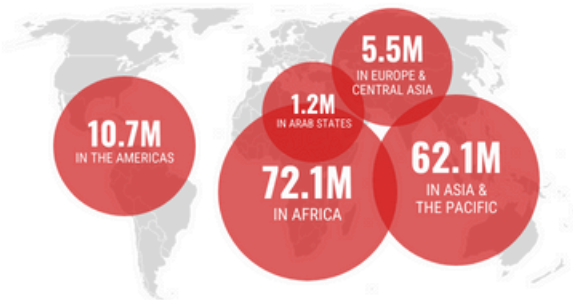
Sexual exploitation

WHAT IS CHILD LABOR?

Child labor is work carried out to the detriment and endangerment of a child, in violation of international law and national legislation. Many do not receive proper nutrition or care.

Most prevalent areas of child labor



152 Million

victims of child labor. They are most common in the agriculture sector where 7 out of 10 work.



73 Million

work in hazardous environments: slavery, drugs, prostitution, recruitment in armed conflict.



38% of Girls

in child labor are not reported due to "hidden" forms of work such as domestic work.

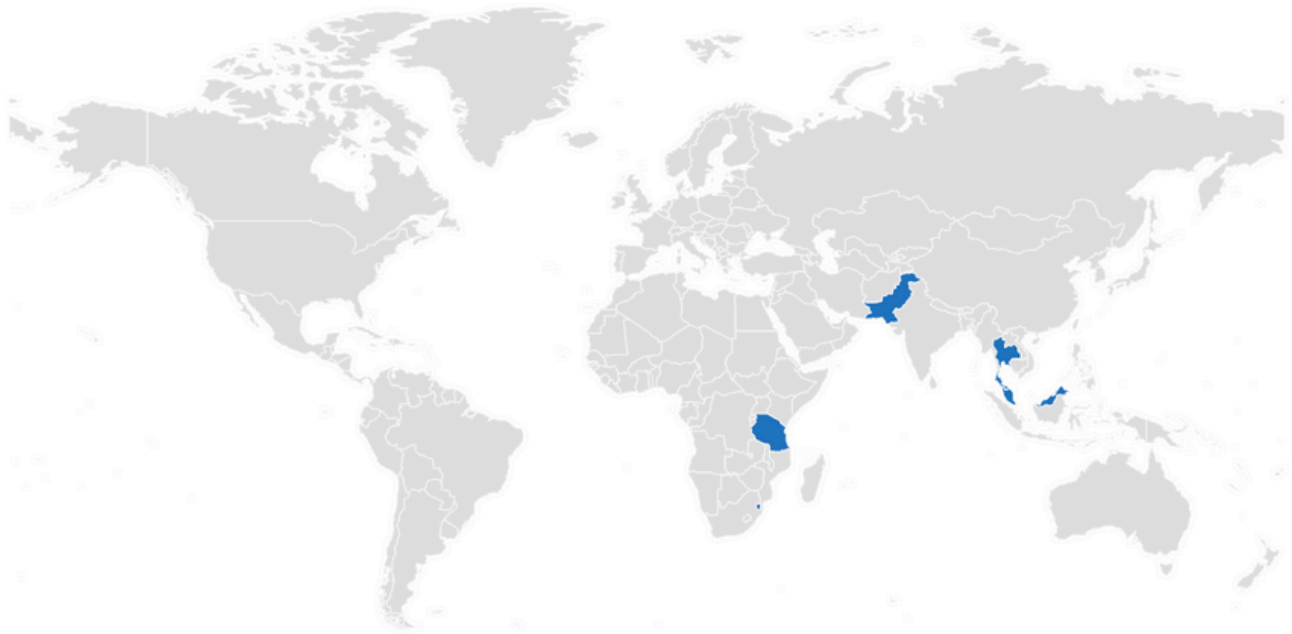

Where We Serve

We have teams and local partners on the ground in Pakistan, Thailand, Malaysia, Eswatini, and Tanzania



Pakistan:

Child slavery usually referred as debt slavery is a severe problem in Pakistan. When families can't pay the debt back, oppressive creditors take their children and put them in prostitution or forced labor.

Malaysia:

Malaysia serves as a source, transit, and destination country for human trafficking. this involves women, men, and children for purposes such as forced labor, sexual exploitation, and organ trafficking.

Thailand:

Sex tourism is a multi-billion dollar industry in Thailand and includes young children. No one should be forced into this lifestyle destroying childhoods and lives. Prevention, rescue, and recovery is our focus.

Eswatini:

Children and young adults trafficked due to deceptive practices including those coming in and out from other surrounding countries is an issue. Prevention, recovery homes, and training is the areas of need for those rescued.

Tanzania:

Tanzania with it's poverty rate so high creates many medical emergencies that are life threatening. Medical surgeries, life saving medicine, and transportation to hospitals is what saves these lives.
